

## HAPPY GROUNDHOG DAY!

I say that because you should be receiving this newsletter very close to Groundhog Day.

Some of you may know the movie, "Groundhog Day" in which Bill Murray plays an arrogant reporter who is begrudgingly covering the annual appearance of Punxsutawney Phil, the most famous of the Groundhogs. Murray's character ends up repeating Groundhog Day over and over again in a seemingly endless time loop. Early on, Murray's character tries all kinds of extreme behavior, testing the possible limits of the time loop. As the loops continue, though, Murray's character starts to use his multiple experiences of the same day to examine, and then change, his priorities and his life.

We don't have the benefit of an endless time loop to work on improving ourselves, but many of us use the beginning of a new year to try to make changes to how we live our lives through various New Year's resolutions.

(Unfortunately, most of us will have given up on those efforts by the middle of February.) Some of us may also make temporary changes to our behaviors during Lent, giving up some habit or favorite food, or adding some kind of discipline to our lives during Lent. Some of us may even quietly hope that these changes will become permanent, or at least more prevalent, once Lent is over.

Our desire for change, for improving ourselves, is great. Most of us are quite optimistic that we can make these changes in our selves, even if we have not been successful in the past. Behind this optimism is both resiliency and arrogance. The resiliency to keep trying, no matter what. And also the arrogance that we can do anything—if we can just find the right motivation, the right plan, the right program.

We often carry that same arrogance into our faith practices, and into our relationship with God. We may think that we can fix ourselves, on our own. We may think that we have to fix ourselves, have to be worthy before we can come to God. We may think that we can find God, or God's favor, if we do the right things, say the right prayers, etc. A professor of mine told the story of a young man who came up to him after class, excitedly announcing that he had given his life to God. The professor's response was to say, sarcastically, "and I bet he was real impressed with it."

The truth is that there is absolutely nothing we can do to find God, or to improve our chances of finding God's favor. The good news is that there is absolutely nothing we need to do, to find God or God's favor. That's because God does all the work. God is the one seeking us out. God finds us, no matter where we are, not matter how we are.

God claims us in baptism, and through baptism, we are born anew each and every day, each and every moment. We may not have the endless time loops that Bill Murray's character had in "Groundhog Day," but we have something even better. Endless life, eternal life, through the grace of our loving God.


**Women's Servant Trip

### Adult Spirituality Retreat April 15-17, 2018

Biblical scholars often come up with very different ideas regarding well-known passages, insisting that people have missed the point of the story for centuries. Sometimes this can be very troubling; other times, it may actually be refreshing. There are times when a story that always bothered us may turn out to be more meaningful than we imagined —but, then scholars have also acquired a reputation for sometimes ruining people's favorite Bible stories. At this retreat, we will take five well-known passages from the Gospels and do some old-fashioned Bible study, exploring the passages and paying careful attention to some of the details. But we will do this with a "twist" —in each case, Dr. Powell will explain why some interpreters think the traditional understanding is wrong and why they propose a different reading.



Mark Allan Powell is Professor of New Testament at Trinity Lutheran Seminary and an internationally known biblical scholar. He is editor of the HarperCollins Bible Dictionary and author of more than 30 books and DVDs on the Bible and religion, including the widely used textbook, *Introducing the New Testament* (Baker Academic). He has also written in the areas of spiritual formation (*Loving Jesus*), stewardship (*Giving To God*), and homiletics (*What Do They Hear?: Bridging the Gap between Pulpit and Pew*).
