

Happy Halloween, Happy Thanksgiving...Merry Christmas?

I write these words at 1 o'clock in the morning just a few days before Halloween. It seems we have a house visitor -- a large, plump, healthy-looking BAT! Perfect timing, I'd say. While our grandchildren 440 miles away are decorating the front of their house with fake spiders and bats, Jill and I are one-upping them with the real thing! Bats are nice, don't get me wrong. I like bats!



They're good for the ecosystem and helpful at controlling bugs. But, honestly, when they buzz you no more than a foot above your head when you're lying in bed trying to get some sleep, it's more than a little unnerving. Jill thought she heard the sound of "flapping wings" in her half-sleep, which caused her to open her eyes just in time to see the critter pass barely above her face. Up she shot out of bed -- and, with her scream, so did I. So here we are at 1am, taking a momentary break in a relentless search to find our new friend and escort him (her?) not so graciously out of the house.

Honestly, I never thought I'd be writing about bats and how, in at least one way, they remind me of my relationship with Jesus. I can't help but ponder it, though, as I sit here in the middle of the night, wishing the little guy would just let us find him, handle him, and transport him tenderly to freedom. Instead he exhausts himself trying to flee. Whenever we get close enough to attempt a capture, he flies away.

We do that sometimes in our faith life, don't we? If anything, the Christmas gospel is the story of how God wasn't content to love and care for us from far away, but chose instead to come near to us in human form, to personally capture our hearts and lead us to freedom from hurtful ways and into a more satisfying, productive and healthy way of living. We run, though. As little Louisa Von Trapp sang at bedtime in The Sound of Music, "I flit, I float, I fleetly flee, I fly." That's us! We turn away from the choices and patterns of living that God prescribes for us, and instead gravitate toward actions and attitudes that aren't all that good for us (or others). We hold grudges, we engage in bad habits, we do what we know is not right, we treat others poorly. The list goes on. God says, "Enough!" God comes to us in the baby Jesus -- "Emmanuel!" -- to rescue us from ourselves and invite us into a new way of living.

I've been reading Max Lucado's book Next Door Savior. In it, he beautifully describes what God has done in the Christmas Baby: "What a world God left, becoming a one-celled embryo and entering the womb of Mary. The God of the universe kicked against the wall of a womb, was born into the poverty of a peasant, and spent his first night in the feed trough of a cow. The God of the universe left the glory of heaven and moved into the neighborhood. Our neighborhood! Who could have imagined he would do such a thing? Why? Because God loves to be with the ones God loves."

That says it all. We may run from this Savior like the ever-elusive bat is running -- actually flying -- from Jill and me this very minute. But thanks be to our very persistent God who will stop at nothing to seek us, pursue us, gather us, rescue us and free us to new life. Why? Because God loves us that much.

Merry Christmas, people of Christ Lutheran Church! Happy Thanksgiving! (And, oh yes, Happy Halloween.) Now if I can just find that bat...





Kathleen Grissom, New York Times bestselling author of the highly anticipated *Glory Over Everything*, established herself as a remarkable new talent with ***The Kitchen House***, now a contemporary classic. In this gripping novel, a dark secret threatens to expose the best and worst in everyone tied to the estate at a thriving plantation in Virginia in the decades before the Civil War. Christmas can be a painful time for some people. It may be the first Christmas without a loved family member; it may be the first Christmas away from "home"; it may be a time that has *always* been difficult; it may simply be that this particular Christmas is an especially anxious time in your life.

While the constant refrain on the radio and television, in shopping malls and churches, proclaims the happiness of the season and joyful gatherings with family and friends, many people find these to be reminders of what they have lost or have never had. The anguish of broken relationships, the insecurity of unemployment, the weariness of ill health, the pain of isolation, the uncertainty of one's future - all these can lead to feelings of hurt and anxiety in the very midst of the celebrating and spending going everywhere you look. Seldom does the Christmas season provide space and time to acknowledge sadness and concern.

It's time to change that. Blue Christmas is a worship experience that acknowledges the sunken spirits of those who find it difficult to feel joy during this season of the year. As the days grow shorter and the darkness fills more of each day, many of us need encouragement to fully live the days ahead of us.

For these reasons, Christ Lutheran Church is offering a special “Blue Christmas” worship service on the longest night of the year -- Friday, December 20th at 5pm. The service will be brief and informal, but will be designed to acknowledge the hurts inside of us even as we remember the promises and hope that God gives.

Come join in sharing and hearing prayers, scripture, reflection and song as we acknowledge God's presence in the lives of those who mourn, those who struggle and those who hurt. Everyone is welcome.
